Core Pillars of the CEN Model

The CEN architecture is defined by the following strategic pillars, designed to foster community wealth and innovation:

- **Free Educational Access:** Providing public, ongoing, and future-proof education focused on global market innovation, IP law, and trend analysis for all participants.
- **On-Site Research Laboratories:** Integration of advanced lab facilities within the node to facilitate real-time product development and scientific research.
- **IP & Legal Incubator:** On-site expert IP counsel to assist students and parents in protecting and monetizing innovative concepts before they enter the mass market.
- **Data Sovereign Protocol:** A secure internet infrastructure that rewards users for identifying market trends, ensuring economic returns are routed directly back to the participants and the CEN.
